Established in 1967, United Way of Northern Arizona (UWNA) serves communities throughout Coconino, Navajo and Apache Counties (off the reservation), with Chapters in Flagstaff, Page and Northeast Arizona.

United Way of Northern Arizona works to advance the common good by creating lasting changes in community conditions. UWNA accomplishes this through its partnerships and alliances in each community it serves, focusing on three action areas: **EDUCATION, INCOME** and **HEALTH**—a quality education leads to a stable job, good health and sufficient income to support a family.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Every day UWNA is focused on the fundamentals of improving lives in our community. This year hundreds of volunteers and community partners UNITED together to make a difference in the lives of others.

EDUCATION: KinderCamp is a targeted intervention school readiness program designed to help children with “high needs” develop the social-emotional, academic and literacy skills needed to succeed in kindergarten and beyond. In 2011, UWNA and Round Valley Unified School district partnered to bring KinderCamp to families in the Northeast Chapter.

INCOME: The VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) program, managed by UWNA, works to help families receive their Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) by providing free tax assistance to those earning less than \$49,000. In 2011, the VITA program helped 102 families and brought over \$181,001 in refunds to those families in the Northeast Chapter.

HEALTH: UWNA established the Wallow Fire Fund to provide assistance to families impacted by the disaster. Funds went directly to local partners providing basic needs.
